Hog Donation Benefits Humane Society

In October, Hog member, Ron Dennis, loaned sound equipment to the Dane County Humane Society for use with their Halloween haunted trail. After two successful weekends of use, he was asked what it would cost to obtain a small system for various uses. So began the roundup.

Ron had two speakers that were not being used along with an extra microphone and some cables. Local songwriter/performer, Stephen Lee Rich, donated the heart of the system, a 4 channel powered mixer which had seen years of use at open mics and other gigs. Ron obtained permission from Hog Coordinators to donate two unused (missing parts) speaker stands and a microphone stand. Ron repaired the stands, and within a short time, checked out the complete system.

On December 13, Ron presented the system to Brooke Lewis, Wildlife Rehab Coordinator. He set it up and went through a brief training on its various uses and how to properly use the system. Ron estimated the donated equipment value at \$475.

The Society was thrilled at this donation and sent out huge thanks to everyone involved.
